Winner to be announced at Dinner on 31/03/2022.


#### Clip from Website:

Erin ONeill helps families struggling with addiction. Brave Hearts is a support group for families with a loved one dealing with substance use. Erin was compelled to start the group because of her own lived experience within her own whanau. She felt families needed more peer support and education during this difficult time. In its five years Brave Hearts has helped hundreds of families. Beginning life in Tauranga with 60 members, Brave Hearts is now a nationwide network of face to face and online support meetings. It's services include developing family coping strategies and connecting members with clinical counselling. Encouraging families to stay unified and strong, Brave Hearts offers non judgemental and empathetic support. Brave Hearts has also undertaken research to support this service. Erin's tenacity has provided many parents and families with the help they've needed to get their family member into recovery and to move towards the ultimate goal of living addiction free.
